# **Chairman's Report**

# Welcome to the Summer season. Let's hope by the time you read this, the tennis players among you will be on court in pleasant spring conditions.

It is good to note that we were generally able to continue playing tennis throughout the winter, a large programme of leagues matches was (largely) completed, and few games were lost to ice and snow and none to Covid. Congratulations to the first squash team, ably captained by Simon Ruff, on their promotion to the dizzy heights of Division 2. His entertaining report is on page 5.

It was hugely frustrating that the squash court heaters failed for periods in December and January, some of which coincided with a very cold patch that made the courts unplayable. We eventually managed to solve the main problem by replacing the multiple thermostats in each court – my thanks to Dinny Ravet for her labours to achieve this and apologies to squash players that it took a time to find the solution.

Everyone will have noted the successful introduction of electronic card readers for the tennis and squash lights and heaters. There were a few teething troubles caused by the weakness of the GPS signal the meters use to process payments, but these were resolved in a couple of weeks. If anyone wonders what the new pyramid-shaped contraption is by the ventilation control panel in the squash court gallery, it is the special antenna which supercharges the GPS signal.

The card readers arrived at the peak of the energy price hikes. Members will have been less enthused that we had to put up meter prices, but at least the new system gives us the flexibility to be responsive to energy price movements, whether up or down. We were lucky in one sense: thanks to Roy Seger, our Treasurer, our fixed price gas contract lasted until November and he held off fixing our next contract until prices had come back down from their peak. That meant we did not need the anticipated further increase in meter prices in December. We will monitor usage and costs closely over the next few months and see what adjustments we need to make.

Progress on our big projects has been disappointingly slow. The good news is that Anchor, the owner of the St Luke's tennis court, has recently reaffirmed its willingness to sell the court to us. The bad news is that the process seems to take ages, and in the meantime, we are not able to resurface the court and raise the facilities to the standard we want there. We will do this as soon as we can.

The other big project is conversion of the club to a company limited by guarantee. This is more within our control, but the

restructuring committee is debating intensively how best to secure the assets of the club for future generations of members. The existing rules of the club already have what the lawyers call an "asset lock", very similar to a community interest company, so in the event of our dissolution, the surplus assets of the club would be split between the LTA and England Squash. That means there is no incentive to any member to wind up the club as has happened to several in the neighbourhood. Obviously, the last thing we want is for Stormont to be wound up or unwittingly to create any incentive for it, but we also want to ensure that in these remote circumstances, the rules do not potentially lead to the LTA and ES selling the land to the detriment of members and the local community.

Finding a route that the committee can recommend to the membership is taking longer than expected. Nevertheless, I remain hopeful that we will find one over the course of the next few months. In that case, we will convene an extraordinary general meeting and give members a chance to vote on the proposals which would be set out in a circular giving members sufficient detail to assess them fairly and reach their own conclusion on the wisdom of what is involved.

I am pleased to report that the financial position of the club remains robust, so we are well placed to make the investment that the acquisition and improvement of St Luke's involves. We will also continue our cycle of redecoration and refurbishment at Lanchester Road, albeit within the constraints of our existing facilities and the current difficulties in finding builders willing to take on the sort of jobs that need doing.

Our forthcoming AGM is on 19 April. I encourage as many of you as possible to attend. It is your chance to tell the committee what improvements you would like to see and for me and other committee members to explain what we have been doing on your behalf. The agenda is set out on page 2. Note particularly that Barbara Kalirai and Daniel Moreno have volunteered to stand as candidates to join the committee. I am pleased to confirm that existing committee members are putting themselves forward for re-election. My thanks to them for their labours on your behalf for the club. The meeting will be held in person in the Club House at 8pm.

I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible.
